



**Paul Thompson** is Professor of Organisational Analysis and Head of Department of Human Resource Management in the Business School at the University of Strathclyde. Amongst his publications are *The Nature of Work: An Introduction to Debates on the Labour Process* (Macmillan, 1983, 1989); *Work Organizations* (Palgrave, 2002 3<sup>rd</sup> ed, with David McHugh); *Organizational Misbehaviour* (Sage, 1999, with Stephen Ackroyd); and *A Handbook of Work and Organization* for Oxford University Press (co-edited with Stephen Ackroyd, Pam Tolbert and Rose Batt, 2004). He was one of two Business and Management representatives on the Research Grants Board of the UK Economic and Social Research from 2000-4, and is currently on the Boards of *Journal of Management Studies*, *Organization Studies* and *Journal of Industrial Relations*. From January 2008 he will be Debates and Controversies Editor of *Work, Employment and Society* as part of the incoming Strathclyde team. Working within traditions of labour process theory and critical realism his research interests focus on skill and work organization, control and resistance, organisational restructuring and changing political economies. He has led major research projects into the commercial vehicle and spirits industries and into call centres. A lifelong labour movement activist, Professor Thompson edited *Renewal: A Journal of Labour Politics* from its inception in 1993 until 2006.
